But don't get carried away just because it's the holidays –make sure to exercise caution when donating money by ensuring that the charity who is asking you for donations is a registered charity. The Canadian Revenue Agency keeps a searchable database of all registered charities in Canada (<http://www.cra-arc.gc.ca/chrts-gvng/lstngs/menu-eng.html>) that will help you to verify charitable status of any organization. Remember that donations made before December 31st can be claimed as charitable donations on this year's taxes.
